### AGENDA ITEM NO. 1: Call to Order

Doug Miller called the meeting to order at 2:00 PM. Lauren Willis called roll of the planning group members to record attendance and a quorum was established.

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 2: Welcome

Doug Miller welcomed new voting, non-voting members and regional liaisons to the Lauren Willis provided meeting facilitation information and instructions.

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 3: Public General comments (Public comments limited to 3 minutes per speaker)

Doug Miller provided instructions for public comments. No public comments were given.

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 4: Approval of Minutes from the December 2, 2020 Region 11 RFPG Meeting

Doug Miller opened discussion on approving the minutes from the February 3, 2021 Region 11 RFPG Meeting.

A motion was made by Bobby Christmas to approve the February 3, 2021 Region 11 RFPG Meeting. Brian Perkins seconded the motion. The meeting minutes were approved by consensus.

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 5: TWDB Update/Presentation

Morgan White provided updates regarding the TWDB's review of the RFPG's application for regional flood planning grant funds, the first-ever Chairs Conference Call, and the forthcoming flood planning guidance document.

### **AGENDA ITEM NO. 6: Other Presentation**

Ashley Freidberg, Guadalupe-Blanco River Authority (GBRA), presented on the Lower Guadalupe Feasibility Study & Mitigation Strategies. Due to audio quality issues, the RFPG requested Ashley present this again at a future meeting.

AGENDA ITEM NO. 7: Pre-Planning Public Input: The RFPG is soliciting public input regarding suggestions and recommendations as to issues, provisions, projects, and strategies that should be considered during the flood planning cycle and/or input on the development of the regional flood plan (as required per Texas Water Code §16.062(d) and 31 Texas Administrative Code §361.12(a)(4))

Doug Miller opened the floor for public comments. No public comments were given. The members discussed scheduling the next pre-planning meeting in the early evening to allow for more public participation.

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 8: Update from Region 10 (Lower Colorado-Lavaca) and Region 12 (San Antonio) Liaisons

Ron Fieseler (Region 10 Lower Colorado-Lavaca Liaison) stated that Region 10 is working on the same timeline as Region 11. Annalisa Peace (Region 12 San Antonio Liaison) stated that Region 12 working on same timeline as Region 11 and recommended the Executive Committee review Region 12 statement of qualifications for the technical consultant. Suzanne Scott named as the liaison from Region 12 to Region 11. Suzanne Scott added RFQ will be posted soon, the website is region12texas.org, and meetings are being held on the third Tuesday every other month at 9am (next meeting is April 20<sup>th</sup> at 9am).

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 9: Update from RFPG Sponsor (GBRA) regarding status of

### a. Regional Flood Planning Grant contract with the TWDB

Lauren Willis verified that the grant application is with TWDB and is being reviewed.

### b. Request for Qualifications to initiate procurement for a technical consultant

Lauren Willis reviewed the questions received on the Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for technical consultant(s) to support the development of the regional flood plan and reported that the RFQ response submission deadline was extended until March 12, 2021 due to winter storm impacts. The Executive Committee plans to meet to review RFQ submissions the week of March 22<sup>nd</sup> and to conduct interviews the week of March 29<sup>th</sup>. The Executive Committee plans to make a recommendation for selection to the full RFPG in the April meeting.

### AGENDA ITEM NO. 10: Public General comments (Public comments limited to 3 minutes per speaker)

Doug Miller provided instructions for public comments. RFPG members discussed how best to conduct additional stakeholder outreach to increase public participation. No public comments were given.








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### **Flood Events**



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### Sink & Purgatory Creeks

- 1970 Flood 18" in 30 hrs
- 25% of City under water 2000 acres, 2 deaths
- 5 Flood Control Dams
- Built in 1980s/1990s
- Improved protection DS on Sink and Purgatory Creeks
- Impacts of development & Atlas 14 on future risk reduction






### San Marcos River, Sink & Purgatory Creeks Efforts Underway

- Atlas 14 H&H update
- Purchase of upstream conservation lands
- Purchase of undeveloped floodplain properties
- Purgatory Creek Improvements project
  - Limits downstream of flood control dam to San Marcos River
  - Flood reduction, natural channel design, water quality, recreation, bike/ped connectivity
  - \$40 Million +
- Stormwater system discharges with water quality treatment



### **Cottonwood Creek**

- Still relatively undeveloped watershed
- IH-35 barrier with lack of conveyance
- Overflows to north along west side of IH-35
- Impacts to existing development






## **Cottonwood Creek Efforts Underway**

- Atlas 14 H&H update
- 2D modeling study to better understand overflows
- TxDOT coordination on conveyance improvements
- Upstream regional detention analysis
- Protection of floodplain storage/conveyance from development



### **Blanco River**

- San Marcos Blanco River Damage Center
- 436 sq mile drainage area
- Upstream narrow canyons & steep stream bed
- Valley widens & stream bed flattens
- Overflow diversions up to 100,000 cfs
- Greatest damages






Blanco River Overflows into the San Marcos River Basin




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Date of Historic Flood Event




## **Blanco River Efforts Underway**

- Atlas 14 H&H update
- 2D modeling study to better understand overflows
- \$36 Million in CDBG Disaster Recovery Funds
- Projects to improve localized flooding
- Blanco Riverine project reduces impact of Blanco River overflows into Blanco Gardens neighborhood
- Coordination with Hays County on identifying regional/larger projects




Blanco Riverine CDBG-DR Project

- \$17 million project
- 315 structures benefitted in 100-year event











## **Blanco River**


- Long Term Option for Bypass Creek
- Evaluated with Corps and CDBG-DR Feasibility Study
- Controlled overflow
  location
- \$74 Million
- Adjacent to new Loop 110
- Protect corridor from development



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




## USACE Detention Evaluation

- 43,690 acre-feet of storage required
- In Blanco County / western Hays County
- Impacts multiple existing structures, significant ROW, displacements
- Only provides benefits if rains upstream of pond
- Cost: \$73 million

## **Blanco River Detention Sites**



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## **Enhanced Floodplain Regulations**

- No rise requirement in floodplain
- Compensatory floodplain storage requirement
- 100-yr floodplain easement
- Impervious cover limitations in stream corridor & buffer zones
- Finished floor 18-inches above base flood elevation
- Floodplain buffer for finished floor requirements to maintain 18-inches above BFE
- Regulations integrated with watershed protection
